The following families are waiting on sponsorships

Can you make a difference to their lives and assist with support for educational supplies or fresh / long life food deliveries? The following information is genuine. This list is only an indication of the types of families that are in need of help to just get through each day!

Winston (6), Kaylin (9) Philip Jnr (Infant) from Manenberg.

Manenberg is one of the biggest gang areas in Cape Town at the moment. These children have had people shot dead right outside their home plus another shooting just two streets over from them. They can no longer play freely anymore because of the number of shootings. They live with their mum and dad at their grandparent's house. Both grandparents work, but the family is struggling, particularly when it comes to feeding everyone. At the start of the school year The Future Factory provided school books, pencils, etc. so the children could go to school. Last year Kaylin (9) was diagnosed with type 1 diabetes and is on insulin injections for the rest of her life. The family had to adjust to this, and it is important that they have enough food for Kaylin, who has to have regular, substantial means to control her sugar levels.

Melissa (15) and Brittany (8)

The girl's mother has had to move from the home to find work. She works in the radiology department at an oncology unit in East London and is a single mother. When mum had to move for work, the children moved in with grandparents. This was to ensure no disruption to their schooling. Both do dancing and Melissa learns trumpet through her school. Your assistance is needed to meet the costs of school fees.

Miche (16)

Miche moved from Jo'burg to Cape Town last year. Miche's parents have separated and her mother is struggling to pay school fees. The school has issued warning; if school fees aren't paid she will lose her place at the school. She enjoys dancing and is a talented singer.

Habeeb (8)

Lives in Mitchell's Plain, eldest of four children. Again, the parents are struggling to pay school fees, equipment, etc. He lives with mother, and often stays with grandparents on weekends.

How much of your donation goes to the cause you choose to support:

If you require a tax deductible receipt, 95% of our contribution will go DIRECTLY to the purpose of your individual sponsorship. For example, if you donate 50.00 per month for fresh and long life food supplies for a family, and require a tax deductible receipt, \$47.50 will be spent to supply food to your chosen family.

IF you do not require a tax deductible receipt, 100% of your donation will go directly to your chosen cause.

Why do Waves of Good Hope deduct 5% to issue a tax deductible receipt?

It is very difficult for smaller groups such as Waves of Good Hope to satisfy the Federal Government requirements in relation to being able to issue a tax deductible receipt to donors. The main reason is that the money we raise goes to overseas causes. This is one, but certainly not the only, reason why Waves Of Good Hope applied and have been approved to become a project partner of Global Development Group.

Global Development Group is an Australian based Non Government Organisation [NGO] carrying out humanitarian projects with approved partners who provide aid to relieve poverty.

To cover the administrations costs incurred by Global Development Group in the transfer of funds received from Waves Of Good Hope in Australia to our projects in Cape Town, a 5% fee is charged by Global Development Group. Global Development keep these costs to the bear minimum but I am sure you can appreciate the expenses involved with international money transfers as well as there own administering costs.

Do we take out any fees for Bank Charges or the conversion of Australian Dollars to South African Rand?

If you do not chose to receive a tax deductible receipt, Waves Of Good Hope will transfer the funds directly from our Canberra Account to our Cape town Account for direct distribution to your chosen project or family. We DO NOT deduct any fees that are passed onto us by the banks. 100% of your money will go directly to your cause.

Can you donate a little extra each month to assist Waves Of good Hope with the administration costs associated with running the charity?

Of course! As you may be aware, Dee and Ria currently meet all of the administration costs of running Waves of Good Hope. The costs are kept to a bear minimum but naturally, we do have outgoings that must be met. We have received donations form groups and individuals to put towards our operating costs rather than for direct donations – This is the only way we can keep going. We would strongly encourage you to consider donating a little extra every month to help us out.

If I make a regular commitment to sponsor a child or family for education of food purposes, can I make contact with the family?

Yes, we actively promote contact between sponsors and recipients as this goes such a long way towards building an on-going relationship and allows the donor to really begin to appreciate what a difference they are making. This also creates a 'real' sense of the difficulties faced by some families and individuals. This is not intended to make anyone feel uneasy about there own life style but rather to promote the cultural and community links. You will soon begin to understand the positive nature of the South Africans! Once you commence an on-going sponsorship, if both parties agree (which is normally the case) we will provide both with a short questionnaire and the responses will be sent to the other person via Waves Of good Hope. After the initial contact has been made and ongoing contact agreed upon, Waves of Good Hope will leave it up to individuals to correspondence directly. Please be aware that most people do not have access to any form of email either at home or work. Unless we can provide you with an email address, snail mail is often the only way!

Can you send additional money or gifts to your sponsor family or child through the year?

Although we do not promote regular donations or gifts on top of your commitment, we do understand that special occasions such as Christmas and Birthdays may be personalised a little further by the sending of a small card or gift. This is up to individual sponsor to decide. We would encourage you to think seriously about the other members of the family, some who may be the younger siblings of your sponsorship child, and perhaps send a family gift rather than focussing just on your sponsorship child. We do not, however, encourage you to send money through the post. If you wanted to send a Christmas Bonus payment or the like, please ensure you do this through Waves Of Good Hope. That way we can ensure the money will get directly to the individual or family.
